Barrett Lane/Fairhaven Ext Drainage & Sidewalk Improvements



Project Summary

OC Public Works will host a community meeting to collect residents input on the upcoming drainage improvement and sidewalk gap closure project, located in the unincorporated County area of North Tustin along Barrett Lane, Fairhaven Extension and adjacent roads. The improvements include installing concrete storm drain pipes, curb opening inlets, constructing multiple catch basins, removing existing "V" drainage ditches, and modifying driveway approaches. In addition, OC Public Works would like to gauge the support for the proposed sidewalk, curb and gutter along the east side of Barrett Lane. The proposed drainage and road improvements will improve the existing drainage deficiencies, prevent flooding, erosion and increase safety along Barrett Lane and Fairhaven Extension. The sidewalk improvements will close a gap in the local sidewalk network while enhancing pedestrian safety and mobility for local residents. See below for meeting information.



OC Public Works will host a community meeting to inform residents of the upcoming project. This project is part of the County's Capital Improvement Program and will improve storm water drainage and flow and pedestrian accessibility along Barrett Lane, Fairhaven Extension and adjacent roads.
